### **GREETINGS FELLOW RESIDENTS**

This year has certainly gone off at a fast pace with three months already in the past tense. The much-needed rain was a blessing after the intense heat and I am sure your gardens and open spaces are smiling and bountiful.

Ward 102 was sorely tested by water outages and power related breakdowns from early December 2024.

Loadshedding stepped back into our lives as an uninvited guest with Eskom woes. Scrambling from no loadshedding with an abrupt stage 3 and even more abrupt stage 6 certainly turned City Power upside down and inside out. When a region such as ours sits daily with over 500 open calls, you know this entity is not in control.

# I launched the

project which I created to inspire businesses, residents and community organisations to take part in uplifting our beloved ward.

Grass cutting across the ward has continued even though it started three weeks late into 2025, due to the rain.

On 20 February I launched the 'Reimagine Randburg' project (read the story on p.25) which I created to inspire businesses, residents and community organisations to take part in uplifting our beloved ward. This project has received a lot of media attention and has attracted a positive response from within and outside our ward. I truly believe that this will be a blue print for other wards to use and follow on from.

Other exciting wins for Ward 102 were the following:

- Craighall Residents Association was given permission to fence off the Delta Park section around the weir from City Parks. They are now fundraising to be able to do so.
- I successfully facilitated a partnership agreement between Blairgowrie Community Association (BCA) and City Parks, the Department of Sport, Arts, Culture & Recreation and Johannesburg Property Company. BCA can now manage, oversee and uplift these 3 facilities by fencing off the park (clearing out vagrants), revitalising the pool and the Recreation Centre.



### A WORD FROM WARD 102

This has already had an incredible domino effect across this suburb with other projects being implemented. The swimming pool will reopen on 1 September 2025.

As you can see it has been a busy and exciting 2 months with a number of significant wins in ward 102. I hope to see projects in Bordeaux South and this community actively taking part in 'Re-Imagine Randburg'.

It has been a while since holding a 'meet your Councillor' event in your suburb. I look forward to your invitation and meeting up with you soon.

Remember, together we are stronger and together we can Re-imagine Randburg!

# Initiatives and Maintenance Updates

The Bordeaux South Residents Association (BSRA) security portfolio is managed by dedicated volunteers Fiona and Chad. They oversee all security matters affecting our community.

As we move into 2025, the Bordeaux South Residents Association (BSRA) remains committed to enhancing security measures within our community. Several key projects are proposed as possible new initiatives, with approval pending, to ensure the safety of our residents and the effectiveness of our security infrastructure.

## **Proposed Security Enhancements for** 2025 (Approval Pending)

### 1. New Boom System Implementation

The long-anticipated implementation of the upgraded boom system is under consideration. The new system aims to improve access control efficiency, reduce maintenance issues, and bolster overall security at **key entry and exit points in Bordeaux South**. A more in-depth explanation of this project will be provided at the **AGM**, and we encourage all residents to join us to hear about these exciting possible plans.

### 2. Installation of Barbed Fencing

Plans for the installation of barbed fencing along vulnerable perimeters continue to be a priority. This initiative is intended to further deter criminal activity and enhance the protective barriers around the suburb. A sample mock-up is installed along Riverside Drive, and details will be presented at the next AGM.

### **Crime Statistics Update**

Since the last newsletter, there have been four unreported break-ins within Bordeaux South. Unfortunately, specific details regarding these incidents remain unknown due to the lack of formal reporting.

We remind all residents of the critical importance of reporting all security-related incidents via the BSRA Portal Questionnaire. See below link for questionnaire.

### 1. Boom Gate Servicing

One of the Vega boom gates has been sent for muchneeded repairs. Over the coming months, each of the boom gates will undergo long-overdue servicing to maintain their functionality.

### 2. In-Ground Triggers Repair

Chad, Grant and the Shomrim team are currently working on repairing the in-ground triggers at both the Shell and Vega booms. This maintenance work is essential for the continued efficiency of our security measures. We kindly request residents to exercise caution and be patient while this work is in progress, as it may take some time to complete.

# BORDEAUX RECYCLING WITH RECLAIMERS PROGRAMME

### BACKGROUND

Reclaimers who collect recyclable and reusable materials are the foundation of South Africa's recycling economy. They salvage up to 90% of all materials collected from households for recycling. Without them, our landfills would have closed long ago, and the recycling industry would grind to a halt. Because of reclaimers, South Africa has a recycling rate on par with European countries. Reclaimers save municipalities up to R750 million a year by diverting recyclables away from landfills. Despite these contributions, reclaimers are not paid for the service they provide. They subsidise municipalities and industry and are forced to survive on the very low payment they receive when they sell their materials.

In 2019, BSRA and African Reclaimers Organisation (ARO) established a partnership to collect recyclable materials from Bordeaux residents. After resolving a few teething issues in the beginning, the programme has been running smoothly ever since with approximately 50% of households participating. We encourage every household to separate recycling materials in their homes and participate in the programme.

# **HOW DOES IT WORK?**

### REMEMBER, IF EVERY HOUSEHOLD RECYCLES AND PUTS MATERIAL OUT ON A TUESDAY,

this will discourage informal reclaimer activity on a Wednesday. It will also improve our recycling and positive contribution towards looking after the environment.



Put your recycling out in your recycling bin, a box, or clear bags (which can be purchased at PnP, West Pack, Builders, etc.) **every Tuesday morning as early as possible.** If you have a recycling bin, you can request an "I give my recycling to the reclaimers" sticker for the bin.





ARO has a truck that collects remaining recycling not collected by Bordeaux reclaimers, from around 8am Tuesdays.



Local Bordeaux reclaimers will collect material that is useful to them using their trolleys. When you come across reclaimers, please greet and thank them – this acknowledgment means a lot!

ARO can take old furniture, e-waste such as old computers, electrical items, washing machines, etc. (See Nandipha's details below) Ensure garden refuse, organic waste (food), nappies, medical waste, etc. are not put into recycling bags. This needs to be put into general waste bins for Wednesday Pikitup collection.

Do not put recycling out on a Monday night as this encourages reclaimers to forage in the evenings and often results in a mess.

# HAVE YOU EVER WONDERED WHAT HAPPENS TO THE RECYCLING YOU PUT OUT ON TUESDAYS?

The recycling from Bordeaux and approximately 60 other locations gets taken to a sorting area that has been established by ARO in Selby, Johannesburg, for sorting and compressing.

Due to the volumes they have managed to gather, ARO has formed partnerships with various organisations who buy recycling materials for reuse directly from them, reducing the supply chain, and ensuring reclaimers benefit as much as possible from the hard work of collecting and sorting. The team meets every morning to review and refine their processes and explore new ideas.

The warehouse is spotless! Considering they are dealing with waste, this is quite a feat. All safety measures are in place, and overall, this group of entrepreneurs could teach many corporates a thing or two.





### **IMPACT ON THE COMMUNITY**

The recycling collected in Bordeaux generates approximately R3500 each week, reaching between 15-20 people and their families in the collecting and sorting process.

This means our "rubbish" provides approximately R175 per week per family to buy food and supplies. For some, this bit of income provides capital to start small businesses selling food and supplies to neighbours.

Every piece of material is used - either sent for recycling, fixed to be sold on, or recreated into something for a new purpose. Not one scrap of paper is left behind and unaccounted for.

### Tell us a little about ARO?

ARO was formed in 2012 because they saw that Pikitup was taking recycling materials to landfills. So an organisation was formed to collect recyclables separately.

# Please explain how the ARO team and trucks work in Bordeaux?

Reclaimers pulling trolleys first collect the light, valuable materials. The ARO truck collects the heavier material such as glass bottles and newspapers.

### What happens to the recyclable materials?

The truck takes the materials to a sorting area in Selby, Johannesburg. They then get sorted and baled and sold on for recycling.

### Who gets money for the material?

The funds received when the recyclable material is sold are shared equally between the ARO team.

### How do you feel about the work you do?

My children are at school because of this job. I can put bread on the table. I am very happy with this job. Thank you to Bordeaux for supporting us with the material.

# **CREATING A COMMUNITY MINDSET**

BY GRANT ROBINSON & AMANDLA KWINANA

Bordeaux South is a community shaped by the dedication of its residents. As a long-time local and active leader, Grant Robinson, Chairman of the BSRA, has played a key role in strengthening the neighbourhood. We sat down with Grant to know the person behind the title and his vision for Bordeaux South.

I hurried into Tipu Café, umbrella in hand, on a slow, rainy Saturday afternoon. A friendly waitress greeted me at the door and quickly pointed out Grant, who was already waiting with a warm smile at one of the tables. It was no surprise that we were meeting at Tipu, nestled within the Old Parks Sports Club undoubtedly Bordeaux South's beating heart, where young and old alike gather.

While many residents, myself included, regularly engage with the BSRA committee through our neighbourhood WhatsApp groups, it's not often that we get the chance to meet them in person. I had the opportunity to sit down with Grant Robinson, the BSRA Committee Chair and Environmental Lead, to learn more about the person behind the role and the work that helps our community flourish.

# Can you tell us a little about yourself and what brought you to Bordeaux South?

We moved into the neighbourhood 22 years ago, when my kids were young. We wanted to get them into schools in the Northern suburbs so we decided to start looking for houses in the area.

We also did some investigations and found that Bordeaux is actually very central. You've got Sandton on the one side, you've got Blairgowrie on the other side, you've got the M1 on the one side, and you've got the N1 on the other side, which are about 20 minutes away each way, which makes it very centralised. It's actually a very well situated suburb. And so we bought our house.

# When and what inspired you to get involved with the BSRA?

It must have been three years ago. BSRA's then chairperson, Trishana Moodley, approached me to help with certain things around the neighbourhood, which I did.

One thing led to another, and when Trishana left the suburb and resigned as chair, it was agreed by the rest of the committee that I would be chairperson.

# What do you love most about living in this community?

I've enjoyed the community. We have a very active committee, and we've got very active community members, which makes it nice, very friendly. And you know, it's like just one big family. If I monitor the groups and I see what happens on the groups, it's actually a pleasure to be here.

# As the chairperson and environmental lead, what does your role entail?

Each committee member does their own management of their portfolio, and I don't interfere with them. They all are responsible people. But I do tend to keep everything together and assist privately where I have to, and in that way, it's working well. And I'm also responsible for looking after the environmental portion of gardens the portfolio.

### Are there any other environmental projects or initiatives that are currently underway? How can residents support?

We continue to tend to the Braamfontein Spruit which runs alongside our neighbourhood. We are happy to report that the spotted-necked otter is still around. Two new raptors were also spotted, an Ovambo Sparrow hawk and a Black Sparrow hawk.

We currently have waste issues. On Wednesdays we have the recyclers coming and throwing out bins and taking the recycling. Part of the reason for that is because many residents have not joined our recycling programme with African Reclaimers Organisation (ARO).

With all this rain we've had, you have a lot of curbs that are overgrown. We know that the curbs belong to the municipality, but we would like to encourage the residents to keep their curbs tidy. I drive through the suburb on a regular basis, and I know where the problem areas are, and it's just with this rain, it is much worse.

We also have a lot of damaged water pipes, which have become dangerous in some areas, and the infrastructure is not what it used to be any more. It has taken local authorities too long to have them repaired but Hilary Baker who oversees BSRA Faults Escalations, is assisting.

# GAUTENG RAPID RAIL INTEGRATED NETWORK (GRRIN)

The Gautrain is back in the news with further planned extensions. These extensions however do not affect Bordeaux South.

Gauteng Management Agency (GMA) CEO Tshepo Kgobe has reported that much of the initial work for Phase 1 has been completed, with the GMA aiming to be "on the ground" within the next three to five years, but not before undertaking all statutory design and consultation processes with all affected stakeholders.

Part of statutory requirements will include obtaining Environmental Permitting. This will involve having to undertake an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). This will include extensive specialist studies and public consultation and is a process that usually takes one year before Record of Decision is granted. This process has not yet commenced. It will be imperative for Bordeaux South Residents to get involved at this stage. This is one of the stages where we as residents are at the strongest to get our voices heard and where we can ensure negotiations are in favour of our suburb.

Our dedicated team is regularly following up on Phase 1, but to date there has been no communications from the GMA. We commit to providing residents with any news we might receive.

My mountain bike weighs a little over 10kg, and I weigh 85. The various bicycles my daughter has had, starting with a little 12" that weighed probably around 10kg, then 14, 16 and now 18" all weigh 12kg and more (for a 15-25kg child).

So do the maths. If my bike weighed in proportion to my weight like a kid's bike does to a kid's weight, my cheery whip would weigh 50 or 60kg.

It's insane, but that's how it is – even if you buy your little one something costing R5000-R6000, they're still stupidly heavy things for little legs to get moving.

You can make it lighter by ditching the training wheels (look for "Berm Peak training wheels" on YouTube), getting rid of the back-pedal brake aka coaster brake (look for "Berm Peak dumbest law" on YouTube)... but that's it. It's heavy. Damned heavy. There is a problem on most bikes I see that is very, very fixable. The wheel bearings and bottom bracket (pedals) bearings are very stiff.

I set up my little bicycle workshop (www.bordeauxcycleworx.com/bc) at the tail end of last year because I like fixing bicycles, and I like even more seeing that they work well, are safe, and above all are fun to ride.

I was relentlessly horrified to see kids on bikes at the little park with brakes flapping in the breeze and wobbly wheels.

I can count on the fingers of one tentacle the number of bikes I've had in to the workshop that didn't have at least one bearing that was very slack, or more often, way too tight (and inevitably with filthy caked grease inside).

So the poor little kid has to try get this flippin' heavy bicycle moving, while working against bearings that are fighting back. It's not hard, and not expensive, to fix. Pull it apart, clean it out, regrease, reassemble and set the bearings.

So – easy test. Get the chain out the way (careful of the dirty grease on your new mohair sweater!) and spin the wheel or pedals. It should spin perfectly freely – no gritty feeling, no noise. It should also not be able to move laterally even a tiny bit. If you try rock it side to side... zero play. Zilch. A

The Willows celebrates serving the Bordeaux and neighbouring communities for 50 years! Started in 1975 as a playgroup in the adjoining garage of the Pledger household by our founder and my mother, Win Pledger, the Willows became a Montessori method school in 1980 and as such is one of the oldest Montessori schools in South Africa. As a child growing up on the school property I remember the cows from the St Stithians boarding establishment grazing in the veld opposite, where the Scout Hall is now situated. The Willows' children regularly went for forays into the veld and river as part of their day's play.

We still strive to keep children grounded and in touch with nature by taking a section of the river, adjacent to the Scout Hall, under our wing, cleaning up the litter and keeping the weeds, poplar seedlings and overgrowth at bay.

The children grow veggies and take care of their butterfly and bee garden. Our rabbits have free range of the playground and our children learn to connect with and respect nature. They are, after all, the custodians of the future.

Since the inception of our Nursery school, we have adapted to the changing needs of the community by establishing a Toddler class (from 18 months), a Primary (Gr 1 - 7), an Aftercare programme and a Learning Centre in the afternoons that specialises in Maths and Language, which is open to all children, no matter where they are enrolled.

Our ethos remains true to our roots, which is to respect the individual learner, promote integrity and independence, and to provide a low anxiety learning environment in classrooms enriched with the wonderful array of Montessori learning materials.
